

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


With a wide range of juicy bracket colors available, Leif is a deliciously simple wall shelf, ready to add rad to any of your rooms.

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





#### Installation Steps



Yo, here we go! Position the first Leif bracket on your wall, ideally on a stud or blocking. See Rad Tip 0 on page 7 to learn more about studs and blocking. Mark the top-most fastener hole with a fastener tip. Remove your bracket from the wall, then grab a can of your favorite non-alcoholic brew and crack it open.




Measure the desired bracket spacing from fastener hole and righteously apply low-tack tape to general mounting area of second bracket. Measure again and draw a short vertical line on the tape. See Rad Tip ② on page 7.




Place a level on the first fastener hole. Find the intersection of the level and vertical line. Use a wall fastener to punch a hole into wall behind low-tack tape. Remove the tape.


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
Install wall fasteners in the top fastener hole locations. Vertically level each bracket. Punch a hole in all remaining fastener locations with fastener tip. If your brackets are on studs or blocking, skip to step 6. If your brackets are not on studs or blocking, proceed to step 5.



Remove the brackets from your wall. Predrill all marked fastener locations with a ¼" drill bit, and install drywall anchors in each fastener hole location crossing drywall that isn't backed by studs or blocking. If you are installing on masonry, you must use a wall anchor rated for masonry use. If you are using your own anchors, we recommend Toggler brand. Take a swig of your brew.



Position the brackets, install all wall fasteners. Confirm the brackets are secure to wall. (Brackets may wiggle left to right at this point. Chillax, installing the shelves will resolve this!) Lay the shelf on your bracket and position as desired. Position the brackets perpendicular to your wall by using a square. Hold the shelf in place and install all shelf set screws, then repeat for remaining shelves. Take another swig of that sweet, sweet nectar.



Stand back and relax. You did it! Fistbump your buddy, if present. Gently place your Ninja TurtlesTM box collection on shelf and admire! # ① Fasten Into All Studs & Blocking The Bracket Crosses

#### ② Bracket Spacing & Position

③ Use Shims to Correct Shelf Sag



1.1 Studs are the vertical 2x4 boards that make up the bones of your walls. They provide solid structure for your shelves to attach to.



2.1 Bracket spacing is up to you. It's part of Leif's insanely cool aesthetic. With that said, these brackets should never be more than 48" apart. Saggy shelves suck!



3.1 To remove sag, a shorm can be used. If you do not have a wood shim, something solid like a dime or washer can be placed between the wall and the bracket edge to raise or lower the rod elevation.



1.2 Blocking is typically added later between studs in the wall for additional support to mount shelves to, and is usually made from 2x4 or 2x6 lumber.



2.2 If you want our opinion, brackets should be set 3½" OC (on center) from each end of the shelf, with an additional centered bracket for shelves over 48".
