
Installation Steps




Yo, here we go! Position your Roderick Hanger Hook on your wall, ideally on a stud or blocking. See Rad Tip ① on page 7 if you don't know what blocking is. Rotate hook until hanger catch is oriented vertically. Mark the top-most fastener hole with a fastener tip. Remove your hook from the wall, then grab a can of your favorite non-alcoholic brew and crack it open.




If top and bottom fastener holes are aligned on studs or blocking, install bugle head wall fasteners (②) in the top fastener hole locations. Punch a hole in all remaining fastener locations with fastener tip. See Rad Tip ③ on page 7 to ensure you are using the correct fastener.




Fastener holes that are not on studs or blocking require a wall anchor. Remove the hook from your wall. Predrill all marked fastener locations not crossing a stud or blocking with a ¼" drill bit, and install drywall anchors in each fastener hole location crossing drywall. Take a swig of your brew.



Position the hook, install all wall fasteners. Review Rad Tip ® on page 7 to ensure you use the correct fastener to get the best function and most strength from of your hook.




Use a level to check hook for sag. **See Rad Tip** ② to remove sag. Confirm the hook is secure to the wall.



Align the coverplate cutout with the hanger catch. Then, slide the magnetic coverplate onto the rod to cover fastener holes.

We think it looks best to leave the coverplate cutout in the 12 o'clock position in line with the catch, but you can rotate it however you like once it is past the catch.

Rad Tips

1 Fasten Into All Studs & Blocking The Hook Crosses ② Use Shims to Correct Hook Sag (3) How To Choose Your Fastener Type



1.1 Studs are the vertical 2x4 boards that make up the bones of your walls. They provide solid structure for your hooks to attach to.



1.2 Blocking is typically added later between studs in the wall for additional support to mount hooks to, and is usually made from 2x4 or 2x6 lumber.



2.1 To remove sag, a shim can be used. If you do not have a wood shim, something solid like a dime or washer can be placed between the wall and the hook edge to raise or lower the rod elevation.



3.1 Pan Head: For drywall or masonry, use the supplied pan head fasteners with the included drywall or masonry anchors.



3.2 Bugle Head: Use the supplied bugle head style wood fasteners in areas that cross studs or blocking.
