





Installation Steps




Yo, here we go! Position the first bracket on your wall, ideally on a stud or blocking. See Rad Tip ① on page 7 if you don't know what blocking is. Mark the top-most fastener hole with the fastener tip. Remove bracket from wall, then grab a can of your favorite non-alcoholic brew and crack it open.




Measure the desired bracket spacing from fastener hole and righteously apply low-tack tape to general mounting area of second bracket. Measure again and draw a short vertical line on the tape. See Rad Tip ②.




Place a level on first fastener hole. Find the intersection of the level and vertical line. If you do not have a long enough level, see Rad Tip ③. Use a wall fastener to punch a hole into wall behind low-tack tape. Remove the tape.




Install screws in the top fastener hole locations. Vertically level each bracket. Punch a hole in all remaining fastener locations with fastener tip. If your brackets are not on studs or blocking, skip to step 6. If not, proceed to step 5.



Remove the brackets from your wall. Predrill all marked fastener locations with a ¼" drill bit, and install drywall anchors in each fastener hole location. Take a swig of your brew.



Position the brackets, install all 2" wall fasteners. Confirm the brackets are secure to wall. (Brackets may wiggle left to right at this point. Chillax, installing the shelves will resolve this!) Lay the top shelf on your bracket and position as desired. See Rad Tip @ on page 7. Position the brackets perpendicular to your wall by using a square. Hold the shelf in place and install all 1" shelf set screws. Take another swig of that sweet, sweet nectar.



Stand back and relax. You did it! Fistbump your buddy, if present. Gently place your collection of Vintage 1980's Trolls™ dolls on shelf and admire! Finish off your soda, it's time to celebrate your innate awesomeness! You finished the shelf install and deserve heaps of adulation. If you need more help, please reach out to a shelf geek today.

Rad Tips









1.1 Studs are the vertical 2x4 boards that make up the bones of your walls. They provide solid structure for your shelves to attach to.

When you install Bart correctly, each shelf will handily hold up to 100 lbs.



2.1 Bracket spacing is up to you. It's part of Bart's insanely cool aesthetic. With that said, these brackets should never be more than 48" apart. Saggy shelves suck!



3.1 You can turn a short level into a long one by laying it on a straight object like a yard stick. Just hold it on the wall with your bullet level on top and measure!



4.1 If you want our opinion, brackets should be set 2" OC (on center) from each end of the shelf, with an additional centered bracket for shelves over 48".



1.2 Blocking is typically added later between studs in the wall for additional support to mount shelves to, and is usually made from 2x4 or 2x6 lumber.
